The Beginning

At Camestone Lower School we strive to foster a trusting and warm relationship with all our parents. This relationship begins even before your child starts school. We offer you informal story sessions where you can bring your child, stay and have a cup of coffee and have the opportunity to speak to a member of the foundation team. Alongside these we arrange an initial open evening where you can visit the school and meet the team. During this evening a time will be booked for a home visit in September. The home visit is a personal time to discuss any issues or worries you or your child may have about starting school.

Right from our initial meeting we believe it is crucial that parents know that the foundation staff will value the extensive knowledge and understanding parents have of their child. Along with staff this knowledge will be built on, and will be reflected in your child's 'Learning Journal'.

Every child in the foundation unit will have a Learning Journal. Both parents and staff will be involved in creating this valuable record that we are sure you will treasure for years to come. When your child starts school you will have the opportunity to talk to staff and find out more about your child's journal.

In this booklet we will try to answer some of the questions you may have in relation to your child starting school. If we can be of any further help please contact us at the school where we will do our best to answer any queries you may have.



Where will my child spend their day?

The Foundation Unit is made up of a number of areas. When your child starts school they will have a classroom base and a key worker so they have a special place and person with whom they feel safe and secure.

In order to begin to settle your child they will have short teaching sessions in their group followed by an independent choosing time where they will have the opportunity to reinforce their learning through play activities. These activities will be offered both indoors and outdoors. At times, these sessions may include an adult led or supported activities as well as independent play.

Your child's day will also include time for lunch and snack. The children in the foundation unit independently choose when they will have their snack. Water/milk and fruit is available continually throughout the day.



How will my child spend their day?

A typical day in the foundation unit will start with an informal registration time in key worker groups. The small groups will continue for short teaching sessions supporting all the areas of the foundation stage curriculum. Additional independent choosing sessions will be interwoven between the teaching sessions.




What will your child be learning at school?

"From when your child is born up until the age of 5, their early years experience should be happy, active, exciting, fun and secure; and support their development, care and learning needs."


